NOTICE OF APPEAL TO THE SUPREME COURT

Now come Richard Joseph, Juliet Beth Buck, Roger Bourassa and James Marc Leas, by and through the Law Office of James A. Dumont, Esq., PC, and they appeal the decision of the Environmental Division of the Superior Court dated May 13, 2014, to the Supreme Court.

The development is the changed use of the Burlington International Airport and of the adjacent lands used by the Vermont Air National Guard, an agency of the State of Vermont, in South Burlington, Vermont, for the basing of F-35 fighter-bomber jets, including the changed use of the runways and the construction of millions of dollars of improvements. The landowner is the City of Burlington.

Each appellant is entitled to appeal under 10 V.S.A. § 8505(a)(1) because each person was a party to the Environmental Division proceeding.
