

VT Guard doesn't need the F-35 to have a flying mission.

“(The Air Force) expected Burlington to continue to fly military aircraft if it was not selected to host the F-35A ... there could have been any number of reasonable alternatives available...”

The Air Force also made it clear that the F-35 would put over 6,600 residents in a zone the Federal Government declares to be “unsuitable for residential use.”
75% of the homes in Winooski would become unfit.

Yet the Burlington City Council with full knowledge of these facts voted to allow F-35s at the airport, which is owned by Burlington.

THERE IS A BETTER CHOICE!

One “reasonable alternative” is a transport plane, which would:

- Keep the Air Guard flying
- Create more jobs
- Be no louder than commercial airliners
- Not harm children or the elderly
- Support our troops and could be used for humanitarian missions

Over 2,700 Burlington citizens signed a petition to get an initiative on the March ballot to let the voters decide what we want for our city and our neighbors.
